All cattle entering the National Red Angus Show must meet and follow the requirements outlined in Section J of the Rules & Regulations of the Red Angus Breeder's Guide including but not limited to the following:

- Only registered Red Angus cattle in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. This specifically excludes cattle in Category II and Category III. The decision to show Category 1A and Category 1B together in the classes shall be left to the individual states, with respect to state fairs, and such shows that come under state supervision. All shows under Red Angus Association of America sponsorship will be conducted under a joint show provision wherein Category 1A and 1B show together in same classes. It is mandatory that the category and blood percentage be printed as the certificate states on all stall cards, show programs and sale catalogs at the National and Regional shows.
- All animals entered must conform to all show and association eligibility requirements.
- Cattle entered in any Red Angus show must be officially registered in one of the following: Red Angus Association Herdbook, in the Herdbook of the Canadian Angus Association or any foreign angus association herdbook recognized by the Red Angus Association of America.
- Entries in classes at any Red Angus show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mousing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.
- All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or does not match the registration certificate and cannot be read during processing, it will not be allowed to participate in the show.
- Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.
- The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed in Red Angus competition.
- All females 20 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus

Association of America must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.

- All bulls 9 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must be shown with a nose lead.
- All classes with 10 head or more entered and accepted after processing verifies that all other requirements have been fulfilled, must be split according to age. The numbers after the split should be as even as possible in each sub-class to encourage fair competition.
- Any calf born from a dam entered in the National Red Angus Show after the entry deadline of the show has past, and that said calf is not showing in as individual class, does not need to be registered to be shown along side its dam as her proof of pregnancy requirement. However, the calf must meet the requirements to be registered outlined in Section C of the Red Angus Breeder's Guide and qualify for Category 1A or 1B status as required by Section J, RR-28, General Regulations - a) of the Red Angus Breeder's Guide.
- Any animal entered and accepted after processing verifies that all other requirements have been fulfilled, must show in the same class as entered prior to the entry deadline of the Red Angus Show in question. Calving status does not change the animal's show classification.

Class Numbers:

- 33. Senior Get-of-sire - Four animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.**
- 34. Junior Get-of-sire - Three animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries must have been calved on or after September 1, 2010. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.**

- 35. Produce-of-dam - Two animals, either or both sexes, both shown in their respective classes. Animals shown in this class need not be owned by the exhibitor.**
- 36. Premier Breeders Class - Will be computed from breeder's placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 points for each 1st; 2 points for each 2nd; 1 point for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5. Calculated on breeders of animals for exhibitors only. (In case of a tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner.)**
- 37. Premier Exhibitor Class - Will be computed from exhibitor's placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 points for each 1st; 2 points for each 2nd; 1 point for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5. (In case of a tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner.)**

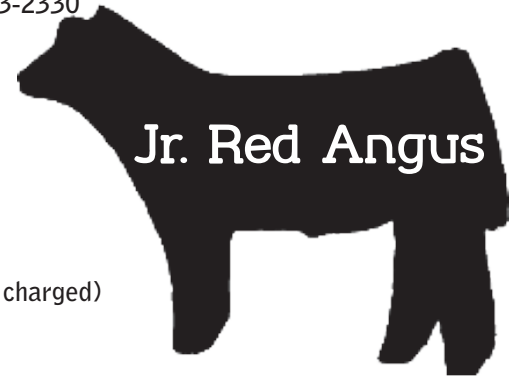

- To be eligible to show in a nationally sponsored Red Angus Junior Show, an exhibitor must be a member of the National Junior Red Angus Association and must not be over 21 years of age on July 1st of the fiscal year of the show.
- Classes for the National Junior Heifer Show will follow the Junior Show classes.
- JRAA members may show an animal in National Junior Heifer Shows that is owned solely by his/her family's ranch; or junior members may show an animal that is owned jointly with other owners but the junior member's name must be on the registration certificate at least 60 days prior to the show. Ownership requirements for the National Junior Heifer Show are subject to the rules and regulations of the hosting exhibition.
- Unless otherwise provided for by local show management, all junior heifer entries in the National Junior Heifer Show will be eligible for competition in the open show, providing there is an open show being held concurrently with the National Junior Heifer Show.
- Any animal entered in a National Junior Heifer Show must have been under the ownership of the junior member or a member of the immediate family of the junior member for a period of not less than 60 days prior to the announced date of judging of the National Junior Heifer Show.
- Indiscriminate substitutions will not be permitted. Each request for substitution will be considered on its individual merit. Approved substitutions will be made only if permitted by the show management. The same ownership requirement set forth in 11c above will apply to any substitutions.
- Entries in any National Junior Heifer Show must conform to the General Regulations pertaining to entries—in open shows.
- Entries in any National Junior Heifer Show are subject to all inspections applicable to open show entries.
- Entries for any National Junior Heifer Show will not be accepted after the announced deadline for entries.
The addition of hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed.

18. Junior Showmanship - Only open to JRA Members 15 years old & younger the day of the show and who entered and exhibited the animal they are showing in this competition (must be owned by the exhibitor as the rules state) in the JR show that day. **

19. Senior Showmanship - Only open to JRA Members 16 years to 21 years of age the day of the show and who entered and exhibited the animal they are showing in this competition (must be owned by the exhibitor as the rules state) in the JR show that day. **
